






After school sche used to play hide and seek with her friends. She used to help her mother with the house chores, because she didn't have any extra activities as she lived in a very small village.

3. Original - compare to original checking, grammar, spelling, word order, etc.
4. Focus on form - focus on past simple, used to.
5. Question Forms - elicit questions in order to get this information from someone.
6. Writing - Interview family member and write their memories.
